BARCOVID

Overarching question

How do the employment, social and economic consequences of the Covid-19 crisis affect industrial relations, collective bargaining and its outcomes in Europe?

Where are we now?

The project will run from April 2021 – March 2023





Research Question 1

• Will the Covid consequences affect the industrial relations landscape and the degree of coordination among employers, workers, their respective representatives, and public authorities in Europe?

Methods

• 1,428 text extractions/items collected from social partners' press releases and newsletters at the national and EU level

(<u>initial goal</u>: approx. 50 items p/m during 24 months = 1200 items).

- Keyword extraction to classify each news item for prevalence of keywords (related to policies and pandemic themes)
- Analysing the monthly updated database: frequency of policies, cluster analysis based on the welfare regimes, comparison of the 1st and 2nd pandemic year, keywords associations, etc.

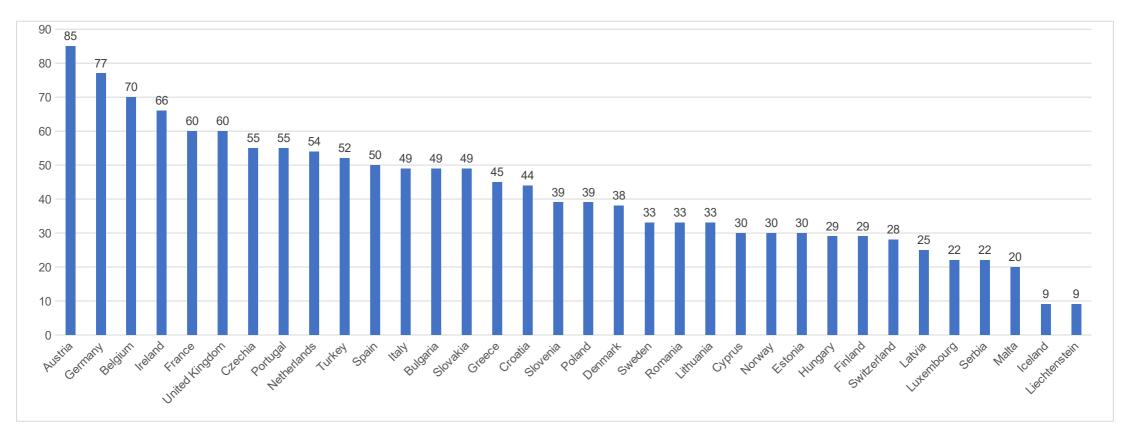
Deliverables

- 3 quarterly reports already published (approx. 7 pages each) about the Covid-19 impact on industrial relations (goal: 8 quaterly reports); the fourth report to be published by the end of June 2022!
- 1 Overarching report Covid-19 impact on the industrial relations landscape (20 pages)

Research Question 2

Will the Covid consequences impact the collective bargaining institutional settings, specifically the renewal of CBAs, their signatories, levels of bargaining and enterprises/organisations covered?

Methods

Collect and Investigate CBAs On schedule

- Investigate for the 600 CBAs in CBA Database whether the expired CBAs have been renewed. Data collection is on schedule.
- 619 CBAs already in the CBA Database, 119 post-covid renewals have been collected, of which 60 are in the Database.

Online survey about renewal strategies In development, scheduled Fall 2022.

- 5 countries (AT, ES, IT, FR, NL) social partners of not-renewed CBAs (N≈50: 10 respondents p/c).
- 13 other countries among signatories or social partners (N≈200: 10-20 p/c).

• Deliverables – scheduled for 2023

- 8 country reports (AT, ES, IT, FR, NL, CEE, Portugal, Candidate countries) (5 pages/c)
- 1 Overarching analytical report (40 pages)





Research Question 3

• Will the Covid consequences impact the clauses negotiated in CBAs, specifically regarding hiring and firing, wages, occupational health and safety, use of digital technologies (e.g. teleworking), work organisation, and surveillance?

Methods

- For 3 countries (ES, IT, NL) renewed CBAs will be entered into the CBA-Database (est. 150 CBAs). We are currently at 55 renewals collected (36%)
- For 2 countries (AT, FR) max 50 CBAs + 50 renewed CBAs will be entered into the CBA-Database (max. 200 CBAs) We are currently at 34 CBAs collected (19%)
- For 13 countries (other) renewed CBAs will be entered into the CBA-Database (max. 50 CBAs in total).
 We are currently at 15 CBAs collected (30%)

Deliverables Scheduled for 2023

- Analysis of the before-after changes, including analysis whether changes are due to COVID-19 or to other causes.
- 8 country reports (AT, ES, IT, FR, NL, CEE, Portugal, Candidate countries) (10 pages/c)
- 1 Overarching analytical report (40 pages)



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
