



## **Indonesia: PDI-P: focus on domestic workers**

The analysis of the political program of the newly elected President with a focus on women issues reveals a clear on legislation and protective measures for all domestic workers, both at home and abroad. Domestic workers make up a substantial portion of working women in the informal sector, which is estimated at 60% of the total economy.

The Indonesian Democratic Party (Struggle), the winning party, has discussed women participation in the labour market and aims to take action in that direction. PDI-P plans to ensure that every woman gets free maternity/delivery health services while she goes into labour.

Indonesian legislation requires an employer to pay for the maternity leave. As a result an employer considers female workers as a burden to whom he has to pay without getting any work done.

Indonesia has no state financed child care/day care system in place.

The PDI-P plans to discuss and pass a bill on sexual assault and harassment.
