October 2020 - Some of **Swiggy**'s delivery partners in Hyderabad have been on a strike since September 15 to protest against low wages. A couple of days after the Hyderabad strike began, Swiggy delivery workers in Noida launched a protest over similar demands. (*Inc42*)

October, 2020 - The **Code on Social Security** directs digital aggregator platforms to contribute 1 to 2 percent of their annual turnover towards social **security** provisions for their workers. But experts say that the legislation should have considered issues with regard to fluctuation of income and continuity in getting work.

October, 2020 - Bangalore: The gig economy will lead **80%** of overall demand for jobs in 2020.

UNITED STATES

October, 2020 - Seattle approves minimum pay rate for **Uber and Lyft** drivers.

The city became the second in the nation to create a compensation standard for taxi drivers, after New York. (*The New York Times*)

AUSTRALIA

October, 2020 - The **gig economy** is much bigger than previously thought, with up to **7 per cent** of working-age Australians - just under one million people - doing "platform work" in the past 12 months. (In The Black)

ARGENTINA

October, 2020 - October 8th a new **international strike** of delivery men took place. In **Argentina**, the **distributors demanded** an increase in payment per order, medical coverage, ART, paid licenses and recognition of the labor relationship they have with the companies. (*Página/12*)

SPAIN

September, 2020 - The Supreme Court rules that the **"riders"** are false self-employed.

Glovo is not a mere intermediary in the contracting of services between businesses and distributors. (*El País*)

SWITZERLAND

September, 2020 - **Geneva** ends **precarious contracts** for **Uber Eats** delivery staff. Uber Eats deliverers will benefit from an employment contract which will guarantee four weeks of vacation and a gross salary of 20.65 francs.

FRANCE

September, 2020 - **UberEats**, **Deliveroo** workers drive French surge in new companies.

The number of new transport businesses jumping **29%** in June and July from a year earlier.

September, 2020 - The government has allocated **RM100 million** for the **career advancement program**.

The **Gig Economy program** provides skills training that will help participants to generate income through the gig economy as freelancers.

Eat Takeaway) has declared
that they intend to stop using
