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The Amsterdam Institute for Advanced Labour Studies (AIAS) is an interdisciplinary institute of the University of Amsterdam in the Netherlands. In 1998, it was established by the universities' departments of economics, sociology, law, psychology and health & safety. It is a unique expert centre for research and teaching in the Netherlands on industrial relations, organisation of work, wage formation and labour market inequalities. AIAS staff performs research in co-operation with renowned experts from the above disciplines at the University of Amsterdam. Much of its research is international oriented. AIAS participates in international research projects, such as the International Reform Monitor funded from the Bertelsmann Stiftung, the FP6 funded New Mode of Governance, the FP4, FP5 and FP6 funded LoWER network, the FP6 funded WOLIWEB project that has contributed to the development of the worldwide WageIndicator project, the Equalsoc network, the EurOccupations project, two WIBAR projects funded from the EU Social Dialogue Program, and the Low Wage in Europe project commissioned by the Russell Sage Foundation (RSF) in New York. AIAS is a partner in the Decisions for life project for the national specificities regarding the content of the web-survey, the inventories underlying the decent work agenda, the comparisons of wages and national industrial relations, and the companies' family friendly policies.
